Depending on the weight and design, scarves will be given out in the winter to needy families, or gifted to The Family Place program participants for Valentine's Day 2006.

Bring your own finished scarf to the Scarf Style Contest table by 1 p.m. on the day of the Knit-Out and Crochet Too, September 10, 2005. 3. All entries must be an original design to win. Scarves created from patterns in the book *Scarf Style* will not be accepted. However, scarves created from a pattern may be donated to The

Family Place. 4. The winners will be announced at 5:30 p.m. at the Knit-Out and Crochet Too. Winners who are not present may be required to pay for shipment of any prize(s) won. 5. The decisions of the judges will be final. 6. All scarves entered become the property of Dallas Knit-Out and Crochet Too, and will be donated to The Family Place. 7. Prizes are awarded as presented and cannot be redeemed for cash.
