The rest of the afghan was designed by you! That's right. Readers uploaded their original designs for a 12-inch square to the gallery at CrochetMe.com. Ten reader-designed squares were selected for publication for the Winter 2010 and Spring 2011 issues of Interweave Crochet.

Now, those twenty square designs have been collected together into this one eBook! Plus, you will get the instructions for creating the final afghan.

## Circles Squared

Kathy Merrick

FINISHED SIZE 12 " by 12 ".
YARN Washable worsted-weight yarn (about
175 yd [161 m]; (424): cream (B), blue (A),
orange (D), purple (E), green (C).
HOOK Size J/10 ( 6 mm ). Adjust hook size if necessary to obtain correct gauge.
GAUGE 13 sts and 9 rows $=4$ " in hdc; first rnd of circles $=4$ " across.

## Note

Square is made of small circles joined as you work, then finished with border.

## Square

Center circle: With B, wrap yarn around index finger 3 times, slide resulting circle off finger, sl st in circle.
Rnd 1: Ch 2 (counts as hdc), work 15 hdc in circle, sl st in top of beg ch-2 to join-16 hdc. Fasten off.

## First rnd of circles:

First circle: With B, work as for center circle.
Rnd 1: Ch 2, join with sl st in hdc on center circle, 15 hdc , sl st in top of beg ch-2 to join- 16 hdc. Fasten off.

## Subsequent circles:

Working counterclockwise around center circle and using photo as guide for color placement, work 6 more circles as foll: Beg as for center circle.
Rnd 1: Ch 2, sk next st on center circle, join in next st, hdc, sk next st on previous
circle, join in next st, 14 hdc , sl st in top of beg ch-2 to join- 16 hdc. Fasten off.

## Last circle:

Beg as for center circle.
Rnd 1: Ch 2, sk next st on center circle, join in next st, hdc in working circle, sk next st on adjoining circle, join in next st, 13 hdc in working circle, sk next st on first circle, join in next st, hdc in working circle, sl st in top of beg ch-2 to join- 16 hdc. Fasten off.
Note: You should have 11 unworked sts on each of 8 circles.

## Second rnd of circles:

First circle: Work circle, joining 3 sts to 3 center sts of 1 circle of first rnd as foll: With B, beg as for center circle.
Rnd 1: Ch 2, [sl st, hdc] 3 times to 3 center sts on circle on previous rnd, 12 hdc , sl st in top of beg ch-2 to join. Fasten off.

## Subsequent circles:

Working counterclockwise around first rnd of circles joining 3 sts to 3 center sts of previous rnd and 3 sts to side of adjoining circle, work next circle as foll: With B, beg as for center circle.
Rnd 1: Ch 2, [sl st, hdc] 3 times to 3 center sts on next circle on previous rnd, sk next st on previous circle, [sl st, hdc] 3 times to 3 side sts on adjoining circle, 9 hdc , sl st in top of beg ch-2 to join. Fasten off.

Corner circle: With appropriate color, ch 2, sk next st on previous circle, [sl st, hdc] 3 times to 3 side sts on adjoining circle, 12 hdc , sl st in top of beg ch-2 to join. Fasten off.

Cont working circles in color sequence, joining 2 B circles bet each corner circle. Note: You should have 8 side circles of B each with 5 unworked sts and 4 corners circles each with 9 unworked sts- 12 circles. Border:
Rnd 1: With A, join in center st of any corner circle, (ch 3, hdc) in same st, *hdc in next 4 sts, [hdc in joining st bet next 2 circles, hdc in next 5 sts] 2 times, hdc in next 4 sts of corner circle, ${ }^{* *}$ (hdc, dc, hdc) in center st; rep from * 3 times, ending at ${ }^{* *}$ on last rep, hdc in same st as beg ch-3, sl st in top of beg ch-3 to join- 96 sts. Fasten off.

Rnds 2-5: Working 1 rnd with D, 1 rnd with E, 1 rnd with D, and 1 rnd with B, join in center st of any corner, (ch 3, hdc) in same st, *hdc in each st to next corner, $* *(\mathrm{hdc}, \mathrm{dc}, \mathrm{hdc})$ in center st; rep from * 3 times ending last rep at ${ }^{* *}$, hdc in same st as beg ch-3, sl st in beg ch-3 to join-128 sts. Do not fasten off $B$ at end of Rnd 5.
Rnd 6: With B, ch 5, 2 dc in same st, *[sk next 2 hdc , (dc, ch 3, dc) in next st] 4 times; sk next 2 sts; sc in next 3 sts [sk next 2 sts, (dc, ch 3, dc) in next st] 4 times; sk next 2 sts; ( 2 dc , ch 3, 2 dc ) in next st; rep from * 3 times, dc in same st as beg ch-5, sl st in 3rd ch of beg ch-5 to join. Fasten off.

## Double Twist Drew Emborsky

## FINISHED SIZE 12 " by 12 ".

YARN Washable worsted-weight yarn (about 300 yd [275 m]; (640): green (C).
HOOK Size H/8 ( 5 mm ). Adjust hook size if necessary to obtain correct gauge.
GAUGE 18 sts and 10 rows $=4$ " in st patt.

## Note

Cables are formed with front post and back post crochet st in a single-row rep.

Let gauge swatch rest for at least an hour before measuring. Post st will pull inward.

## Square

Fdc (see Glossary) 54, turn.
Row 1: Ch 2 (counts as dc throughout), *sk next st, FPdc (see Glossary) in next st, FPdc in skipped st; BPdc (see Glossary) in next 2 sts; rep from * to last st, hdc in last st, turn- 54 sts.
Rows 2-28: Rep Row $1-54$ sts.
Row 29: Ch 2, *FPdc in next 2 sts, BPdc in next 2 sts; rep from * to last st, hdc in top of beg ch-2-54 sts. Fasten off.

## Framed Flower

 Edie EckmanFINISHED SIZE 12 " by 12 ".
YARN Washable worsted-weight yarn (about
150 yd [138 m]; (040): blue (A), green (C), cream (B).
HOOK Size H/8 (5 mm). Adjust hook size if necessary to obtain correct gauge.
GAUGE Rnds $1-5=4$ " square.

## Stitch Guide

Bead st: Insert hook in next st, yo and pull up lp, [yo and draw through 1 Ip$] 3$ times, yo and draw through 2 lps.

## Square

With C, ch 4, sl st in first ch to form ring.
Rnd 1: (RS) Ch 1, (does not count as st), 6 sc in ring, sl st in first sc to join.
Rnd 2: Ch 1, [sc blo, ch 12] 2 times in each sc around, sl st in first sc to join- 12 petals. Fasten off.

Flower center: Join B in front lp of any sc from Rnd 1 , *ch 8 , sl st flo in next sc; rep from * around, sl st in first sl st to join-6 ch-8 lps. Fasten off.
Rnd 3: Join A in any sc of Rnd 2, ch 1, (sc, ch 3 , sc) in same st, *[ch 1 , sc in next sc (holding petals to front)] 2 times **, ch 1 , (sc, ch 3, sc) in next st (corner made); rep from * around, ending last rep at ${ }^{*}$, sc in first sc to join (counts as last ch-1 sp)-16 sc, $12 \mathrm{ch}-1$ sps, and $4 \mathrm{ch}-3$ sps.
Rnd 4: Ch 1, sc in first sp, *ch 1, (sc, ch 6, sc) in corner sp**, [ch 1 , sc in next sp] 3 times; rep from * around, ending last rep at ${ }^{* *}$, [ch 1, sc in next sp] 2 times, ch 1 , sl st in first sc to join- 20 sc, 16 ch- 1 sps, and 4 ch-3 sps. Fasten off.
Rnd 5: Join A in any corner sp, sc in sp, *ch 5, sk next 2 sc, dc in next sc, ch 5 , sk next 2 sc**, (sc, ch 3, sc) in next corner sp; rep from * around, ending last rep at ${ }^{* *}$, sc in beg ch-5 sp, ch 3, sl st in first sc to join- $8 \mathrm{sc}, 4 \mathrm{dc}, 8 \mathrm{ch}-5 \mathrm{sps}$, and 4 ch-3 sps. Do not fasten off.
Rnd 6: Ch 3 (counts as dc throughout), *5 dc in next sp, dc in next dc, 5 dc in next sp, dc in next sc, (dc, ch 3, dc) in corner sp, dc in next sc; rep from * around, omitting last dc, changing to B, sl st in top of beg ch-3 to join-60 dc and 4 ch- 3 sps. Drop A to WS of work, do not fasten off.
Rnd 7: With B, ch 1, sc around, working (sc, ch 3, sc) in each corner sp, changing to A , sl st in beg sc to join- 68 sc and 4 ch-3 sps. Fasten off B.
Rnd 8: Ch 4 (counts as dc and ch 1 throughout), *sk next sc, dc in next sc, [ch 1 , sk next sc, dc in next sc] to corner, (ch $1, \mathrm{dc}$, ch $3, \mathrm{dc}$, ch 1 ) in corner sp, dc in next sc, ch 1; rep from * 3 times, ending last rep with (sk next sc), changing to C , sl st in 3rd ch of beg ch-4 to join- $44 \mathrm{dc}, 4 \mathrm{ch}-3 \mathrm{sps}$, and $40 \mathrm{ch}-1$ sps. Drop A to WS of work, do not fasten off. Rnd 9: Ch 1, sc in each st and sp around, working (sc, ch 1, sc) in each corner sp, changing to A , sl st in beg sc to join- 92 sc. Fasten off C.
Rnd 10: Ch 3, dc around, working (dc, ch 3 , dc) in each corner sp, changing to B, sl st in top of beg ch-3 to join- 100 dc . Drop A to WS of work, do not fasten off. Rnd 11: Ch 1, *sc in next sc, [bead st (see Stitch Guide) in next sc, sc in next sc] to corner sp, (bead st, sc, bead st) in corner sp; rep from * through last corner, [sc
in next st, bead st in next st] to end, changing to A , sl st in beg sc to join- 56 bead sts and 56 sc. Fasten off $B$.
Rnd 12: Ch 4, sk first st, *[dc in next st, ch 1 , sk next st] to corner st, (dc, ch 3, dc) in corner st, ch 1 , sk next st; rep from * through last corner, [dc in next st, ch 1, sk next st] to end, changing to $\mathrm{C}, \mathrm{sl}$ st in 3rd ch of beg ch-4 to join. Drop A to WS, do not fasten off.
Rnds 13-14: Rep Rnds 9-10, do not change to $B$ at end of Rnd $10-124 \mathrm{sc}, 4$ ch- $1 \mathrm{sps}, 132 \mathrm{dc}$, and $4 \mathrm{ch}-3$ sps.
Rnd 15: Ch 1, sc around, working 3 sc in each corner sp-144 sc. Fasten off.

FINISHED SIZE 12" by 12 ".
YARN Washable worsted-weight yarn (about 100 yd [92 m]; (042): purple (E).
HOOK H/8 ( 5 mm ) crochet hook. Adjust hook size if necessary to obtain correct gauge.
GAUGE Rnds 1-2 $=4$ " square.

## Notes

All X sts use a multiple of 5 sts on previous rnd, except for corner X st, which uses same st location as lower left leg of last X st and lower right leg of next X st.

X st after a corner st beg in same st.
X st after an X st beg in next st.

## Stitch Guide

Beg X st: Ch 4 (counts as tr; lower right leg of $X$ st), sk next 3 sts, yo 2 times, insert
hook in next st, yo and pull up Ip, [yo and draw through 2 Ips on hook] 3 times (lower left leg of $X$ st), ch 7 (counts as tr and ch 3 ; upper right leg of $X$ st), yo 2 times, insert hook in top horizontal thread of both lower legs of $X$, yo and pull up Ip, [yo and draw through 2 lps on hook] 3 times (upper left leg of $X s t$ ).
$X$ st: Yo 4 times, insert hook in next st, yo and pull up Ip , [yo and draw through 2 lps on hook] 2 times (lower right leg of $X$ st; 4 lps on hook), sk next 3 sts, yo 2 times, insert hook in next st, yo and pull up Ip, [yo and draw through 2 lps on hook] 3 times (lower left leg of $X$ st; 4 lps on hook), [yo and draw through 2 lps on hook] 3 times (upper right leg of $X$ st), ch 3, yo 2 times, insert hook through top horizontal thread of both lower tr legs of $X$, yo and pull up lp, (4 lps on hook), [yo and draw through 2 lps on hook] 3 times (upper left leg of $X$ st).

Corner $X$ st: Yo 4 times, insert hook in same st as last lower leg of previous $X$ st, yo and pull up Ip, [yo and draw through 2 lps on hook] 2 times (4 lps on hook; lower right leg of $X$ st), yo 2 times, insert hook in next st, yo and pull up lp, [yo and draw through 2 lps on hook] 3 times (lower left leg of $X$ st]; 4 lps on hook), [yo and draw through 2 lps on hook] 3 times (upper right leg of X st), ch 3, yo 2 times, insert hook through top horizontal thread of both lower tr legs of $X$, yo and pull up Ip, [yo and pull through 2 lps on hook] 3 times (upper left leg of $X s t$ ).

## Square

Ch 5 , sl st in first ch to form ring.
Rnd 1: Ch 1, 20 sc in ring, sl st in first sc to join.
Rnd 2: Beg X st (see Stitch Guide), corner X st (see Stitch Guide), *X st (see Stitch Guide), corner X st; rep from * 2 times, sl st in 4th ch of beg ch 7 to join- 1 beg X st, 3 X sts, 4 corner X sts. Rnd 3: Ch 1, sc in first st, 3 sc in next ch-3 sp, sc in next st, *2 sc in next st, 6 sc in next ch-3 sp, 2 sc in next st, sc in next st, 3 sc in next ch-3 sp, sc in next st; rep from * 2 times, 2 sc in next st, 6 sc in next ch-3 sp, 2 sc in next st, sl st in first sc to join- 60 sc.
Rnd 4: Beg X st, X st, corner X st, *3 X sts, corner X st; rep from * 2 times, X st,
sl st in 4th ch of beg ch-7 to join- 1 beg X st, 11 X sts, and 4 corner X sts.
Rnd 5: Ch 1, sc in first st, 3 sc in next ch- 3 sp , sc in next st, sc in next st, 3 sc in next ch-3 sp, sc in next st, *2 sc in next st, 6 sc in next ch-3 sp, 2 sc in next st, [sc in next st, 3 sc in next ch-3 sp, sc in next st] 3 times; rep from $* 2$ times, 2 sc in next st, 6 sc in next ch-3 sp, 2 sc in next st, sc in next st, 3 sc in next ch-3 sp, sc in next st , sl st in first sc to join- 100 sc .
Rnd 6: Beg X st, 2 X st, corner X st, *5 X sts, corner X st; rep from * 2 times, 2 X sts, sl st in 4th ch of beg ch-7 to join-1 beg X st, 19 X sts, and 4 corner X sts.
ch-3 sp, sc in next st, [sc in next st, 3 sc in next ch-3 sp, sc in next st] 2 times, 2 sc in next st, 6 sc in next ch-3 sp, 2 sc in next st, *[sc in next st, 3 sc in next ch-3 sp , sc in next st] 5 times, 2 sc in next st, 6 sc in next ch-3 sp, 2 sc in next st; rep from $* 2$ times, [sc in next st, 3 sc in next ch- 3 sp, sc in next st 12 times, sl st in first sc to join- 140 sc . Fasten off and weave in loose ends. Block to measurements.

## Tunisian Cables

## Angela Grabowski

## FINISHED SIZE 12" by 12 ".

YARN Washable worsted-weight yarn (about 200 yd [183 m]; (40): orange (D). HOOK Size L/11 ( 8 mm ) Tunisian hook and $\mathrm{J} / 10(6 \mathrm{~mm})$ standard hook. Adjust hook size if necessary to obtain correct gauge. NOTIONS Cable needle.
GAUGE 6 sts and 7 rows $=2$ " in Tunisian knit st.

## Stitch Guide

## Notes

Keep sts going onto cable needle looser than general, so fabric doesn't become tight.
Yo in middle of cables loosen cable.

## Tunisian Reverse-Purl Stitch (trps)

Trps uses a combination of reverse and purl sts, but end result has appearance of tss on the back of the piece. This creates a "flatter" appearance to the sts on either side of cable.
Forward row: *Hold yarn to front and insert hook from right to left behind front vertical bar, yarn under then over the hook and pull up Ip, leave Ip on hook; rep from * to last vertical bar at edge, pick up front and back lps of last bar to create firm edge; return pass (RetP; see Glossary).

Cable Front 6 (CF6): Work 3 tks onto cable needle, hold cable needle to front, (sk yo on Rows 8 and 12) work 3 tks onto Tunisian hook, slide sts from cable needle onto Tunisian hook.

Cable Back 6 (CB6): Work 3 tks onto cable needle, hold cable needle to back, (sk yo on Rows 8 and 12) work 3 tks onto Tunisian hook, slide sts from cable hook onto Tunisian hook.

## Square

Ch 50.
Row 1: Pick up lp in each ch across; RetP (see Glossary).
Row 2: *[Tss (see Glossary) in next st, tks (see Glossary) in next st] 3 times, trps (see Stitch Guide) in next st, tks in next 6 sts, trps in next st; rep from * 2 times, [tss in next st, tks in next st] 3 times, tss in last st; return pass (RetP).
Row 3: *[Tks in next st, tss in next st] 3 times, trps in next st, tks in next 6 sts, trps in next st; rep from $* 2$ times, [tks in next st, tss in next st] 3 times, tss in last st; RetP.

## CABLES



This Tunisian cabling method uses a special tool that has a crochet hook on one end and a knitting needle on the other. Where indicated, you use this tool to work three stitches, then you put the tool to the front or back of the work, as indicated. You then work three stitches with the main Tunisian hook. Finally you slide the stitches off the special hook and onto the main hook. This results in three twisted stitches, which is the cable. Instead of the special tool, you can use a regular, straight-shaft crochet hook, but you will want to put a holder on one end to keep stitches from falling off.

Row 4: [Tss in next st, tks in next st] 3 times, trps in next st, CF6 (see Stitch Guide), trps in next st, [tss in next st, tks in next st] 3 times, trps in next st, CB6 (see Stitch Guide), trps in next st, [tss in next st, tks in next st] 3 times, trps in next st, CB6, trps in next st, [tss in next st, tks in next st] 3 times, tss in last st; RetP.
Row 5: *[Tks in next st, tss in next st] 3 times, trps in next st, tks in next 3 sts, yo, do not sk next st, tks in next 3 sts, trps in next st; rep from $* 2$ times, [tks in next st, tss in next st] 3 times, tss in last st; RetP.
Row 6: *[Tss in next st, tks in next st] 3 times, trps in next st, tks in next 3 sts, yo, sk next yo, tks in next 3 sts, trps in next st; rep from * 2 times, [tss in next st, tks in next st] 3 times, tss in last st; RetP.
Row 7: *[Tks in next st, tss in next st] 3 times, trps in next st, tks in next 3 sts, yo, sk next yo, tks in next 3 sts, trps in next st; rep from * 2 times, [tks in next st, tss in next st] 3 times, tss in last st; RetP.
Row 8: [Tss in next st, tks in next st] 3 times, trps in next st, CF6, trps in next st, [tss in next st, tks in next st] 3 times, trps in next st, CF6, trps in next st, [tss in next st, tks in next st] 3 times, trps in next st, CB6, trps in next st, [tss in next st, tks in next st] 3 times, tss in last st; RetP.
Rows 9-11: Rep Rows 5-7.
Row 12: [Tss in next st, tks in next st] 3 times, trps in next st, CF6, trps in next st, [tss in next st, tks in next st] 3 times, trps in next st, CB6, trps in next st, [tss in next st, tks in next] 3 times, trps in next st, CB6, trps in next st, [tss in next st, tks in next st] 3 times, tss in last st; RetP.
Rows 13-16: Rep Rows 5-8.
Rows 17-19: Rep Rows 5-7.
Row 20: Rep Row 12.
Rows 21-36: Rep Rows 13-20 two times.
Row 37: Rep Row 3.

Row 39: With smaller hook, sc across. Fasten off and weave in loose ends. Block to measurements.

$2 d c$ cluster (2 dc-cl): *Yo, insert hook in indicated st, yo and pull up Ip, yo and draw through 2 lps on hook; rep from * in same st, yo and draw through last 3 lps on hook. 3 treble cluster ( 3 tr-cl): *Yo 2 times, insert hook in indicated st, yo and pull up Ip, [yo and draw through 2 lps on hook] 2 times; rep from * 2 times in same st, yo and draw through last 4 lps on hook.
2 treble cluster ( 2 tr-cl): *Yo 2 times, insert hook in indicated st, yo and pull up Ip, [yo and draw through 2 lps on hook] 2 times; rep from * in same st, yo and draw through last 3 lps on hook.

## Square

With F, ch 10 , sl st in first ch to form ring.

Rnd 1: (RS) Ch 1, 24 sc in ring, sl st to first sc to join, do not turn- 24 sc .
Rnd 2: Ch 2, 2 dc-cl (see Stitch Guide) in first sc, *[ch 3, sk next sc, 3 dc-cl (see Stitch Guide) in next sc] 2 times, ch 5 , sk next sc, 3 dc-cl in next sc; rep from * 2 more times, [ch 3, sk next sc, 3 dc-cl in next sc] 2 times, ch 2 , dc in top of 2 $\mathrm{dc}-\mathrm{cl}-12 \mathrm{dc}-\mathrm{cl}$.
Rnd 3: Ch 5 (counts as tr and ch 1), (tr, picot (see Stitch Guide), tr, ch 1, tr, picot, tr ) around post of next dc, *ch 2, sk next dc-cl, sc in next dc-cl, ch 2, ([tr, picot, tr, ch 1] 4 times, tr, picot, tr) in next ch-5 sp; rep from * 2 times, ch 2 , sk next dc-cl, sc in next dc-cl, ch 2, ([tr, picot, tr, ch 1] 2 times, tr, picot) in next ch-2 sp, sl st in 4th ch of tch-40 tr.
Rnd 4: Ch 1 (does not count as st throughout), sc in next ch-1 sp, ch 5, sc
in next ch-1 sp, *ch 5, dc2tog (see Glossary) over next 2 ch-2 sps, [ch 5, sc in next ch $-1 \mathrm{sp}] 4$ times; rep from * 2 times, ch 5, dc2tog over next $2 \mathrm{ch}-2 \mathrm{sps}$, [ch 5, sc in next ch- 1 sp$] 2$ times, ch 2, dc in first sc-20 ch-sps.
Rnd 5: Ch 1,3 sc around post of next dc, ( $3 \mathrm{sc}, \mathrm{ch} 3,3 \mathrm{sc}$ ) in each ch-5 sp to last ch-5 sp, 3 sc in last ch-2 sp, ch 1 , hdc in first sc- 120 sc .
Rnd 6: Ch 3 (counts as part of tr-cl), (2 $\mathrm{tr}-\mathrm{cl}$, ch $4,3 \mathrm{dc}-\mathrm{cl})$ around post of next hdc, $*(3 \mathrm{dc}-\mathrm{cl}, \mathrm{ch} 3,3 \mathrm{dc}-\mathrm{cl})$ in each of next $4 \mathrm{ch}-3 \mathrm{sps}$, ( $3 \mathrm{dc}-\mathrm{cl}$, ch $4,3 \mathrm{tr}-\mathrm{cl}$, ch $4,3 \mathrm{dc}-\mathrm{cl})$ in next ch-3 sp; rep from * 2 times, ( $3 \mathrm{dc}-\mathrm{cl}$, ch 3, $3 \mathrm{dc}-\mathrm{cl}$ ) in each of next $4 \mathrm{ch}-3 \mathrm{sps}, 3 \mathrm{dc}-\mathrm{cl}$ in last ch-sp, ch 4 , sl st in top of next tr-cl-40 dc-cl.
Rnd 7: Ch 4 (counts as hdc and ch 2), sc in next ch $-4 \mathrm{sp}, *[\mathrm{ch} 2$, hdc bet next


2 dc-cl, ch 2 , sc in next ch-3 spl 4 times, ch 2 , hdc bet next $2 \mathrm{dc}-\mathrm{cl}$, ch 2 , sc in next ch-4 sp, ch 2, (hdc, ch 2, hdc) in next tr-cl, ch 2 , sc in next ch-4 sp; rep from $* 2$ times, [ch 2 , hdc bet next 2 dc-cl, ch 2 , sc in next ch-3 sp] 4 times, ch 2 , hdc bet next 2 dc-cl, ch 2 , sc in next ch-4 sp, ch 2, hdc in tr-cl, ch 2 , sl st in 2nd ch of tch changing to A in last st- 52 ch-2 sps. Do not fasten off F .
Rnd 8: With A, ch 1, *2 sc in each of next $12 \mathrm{ch}-2 \mathrm{sps}, 3 \mathrm{sc}$ in next ch-2 sp; rep from * around, sl st in first sc changing to F to join- 108 sc.
Rnd 9: With F, ch 4 (counts as tr), tr in next $24 \mathrm{sc}, * 5 \mathrm{tr}$ in next sc , tr in next 26 sc; rep from * to last sc, tr in last sc, sl st in top of tch changing to A to join- 124 tr . Fasten off F.
Rnd 10: With A, ch 1, sc in top of tch, sc in next $26 \mathrm{tr}, * 3 \mathrm{sc}$ in next tr , sc in next 30 tr ; rep from * to last 3 tr , sc in last 3 tr , sl st in first sc-132 sc. Fasten off and weave in loose ends.

Washable worsted-weight yarn (about 200 yd [183 m]; (40): purple (E) and green (C), 1 skein each.
HOOK Size I/9 ( 5.5 mm ). Adjust hook size if necessary to obtain correct gauge.
GAUGE 13 sts and 13 rows $=4$ " in st patt.

## Notes

Block can be oriented vertically or horizontally.

Untwist balls of yarn occasionally on Rows 2 and 5.

## Square

Row 1: (WS) With E, ch 37, sc in 2nd ch from hook and in each ch across, turn- 36 sc .
Row 2: (RS) Ch 1, sc in first sc, ch 3, drop yarn from hook, join C in next sc, sc in same st as join, *sc in next sc, ch 3, drop yarn from hook, pick up E, keeping both C ch and yarn in front of work, sc in next 2 sc, ch 3, drop yarn from hook, pick up C, keeping both E ch and yarn in front of work, sc in next sc; rep from * 7 times, sc in next sc, ch 1 , drop yarn from hook, pick up E, sc in last sc over C ch, ch 2, drop yarn from hook, turn.
Row 3: (WS) With C, ch 1, sc in first sc with E lp in front of work or to WS, *sc in next 2 C sc, keeping E ch behind new sc, sc in next 2 E sc , keeping C ch behind new sc; rep from * 7 times, sc in next 2 C sts, sc in last E st, turn- 36 sc .
Row 4: (RS) Ch 1, sc across, ch 1, drop yarn from hook, turn.
Row 5: (WS) Pick up E lp, sc in first sc, ch 3, drop yarn from hook, pick up C, with E ch and yarn to back of work or to RS, sc in next 2 sc, *ch 3, drop yarn from hook, pick up E, keeping both C ch and yarn in back of work, sc in next 2 sc, ch 3, drop yarn from hook, pick up C , keeping both Ech and yarn in back of work, sc in next 2 sc ; rep from * to last 2 sts, ch 1 , drop C from hook, pick up E , sc in last sc over C ch, turn.
Row 6: (RS) Ch 1, sc in first sc, *sc in next 2 C sc, keeping $E$ ch in front of new sc, sc in next 2 Esc , keeping C ch in front of new sc; rep from * across, ending with sc in last E sts, turn-36 sc.
Row 7: (WS) Ch 1, sc across, turn.
Row 8: (RS) Ch 1, sc in first sc, ch 3, drop yarn from hook, pick up C, ch 2,
keeping both E ch and yarn in front of hook, sc in next st, *sc in next sc, ch 3, drop yarn from hook, pick up E, keeping both C ch and yarn in front of work, sc in next 2 sc, ch 3, drop yarn from hook, pick up C, keeping both E ch and yarn in front of work, sc in next sc; rep from * 7 times, sc in next sc, ch 1, drop yarn from hook, pick up E, sc in last sc over C ch, ch 2, drop yarn from hook, turn.
Rows 9-36: Rep Rows 3-8, ending on
Row 6. Do not turn.
Trim:
Row 1: (RS) With RS facing and E , ch 1 , sc in each row-end down one side of square, ch 2 for corner, sc in each ch along bottom of foundation ch, ch 2 for corner, sc in each row-end up to corner of square, ch 2 for corner, sc in each sc across, ch 2 for corner, sl st in first sc of trim to join-144 sc. Fasten off E.
Row 2: (WS) With WS facing, pick up C, ch 1 , sc in each sc around, working 2 sc in ch-2 corners, sl st in first sc to join- 152 sc. Fasten off C.

Rnd 7: Ch 1,2 sc in same st, sk next 3 sts, lg-trcl sh (see Stitch Guide) in next st, sk next 3 sts, 2 sc in next st, sc in next 3 sts, ${ }^{2}$ sc in next st, sk next 3 sts, lg-trcl sh in next st, sk next 3 sts, 2 sc in next st, sc in next 3 sts; rep from * 2 times, sl st in first sc to join changing to $\mathrm{B}-28 \mathrm{sc}$ and 4 lg -trcl sh.
Rnd 8: Sl st in next sc, ch 1, [(6 sc in next ch-6 sp, ch 3, 6 sc in next ch-6 sp) (corner made), sc in next 7 sc$] 4$ times, sl st in first sc to join changing to $\mathrm{C}-76$ sc and 4 ch- 3 sps.
Rnd 9: Ch 1, sc in first 6 sc , (2 sc, ch 3, 2 sc ) in next ch-3 sp, sc in next 6 sc , sk next 3 sc , trcl sh in next sc, sk next 3 sc , *sc in next 6 sc , (2 sc, ch 3, 2 sc ) in next ch- 3 sp , sc in next 6 sc , sk next 3 sc , trcl sh in next sc, sk next 3 sc; rep from * 2 times, sl st in first sc to join changing to B-64 sc, 4 trcl sh, and $4 \mathrm{ch}-3 \mathrm{sps}$. Rnd 10: Ch 1, sc in first 8 sc , (sc, ch 3, sc) in next ch-3 sp, sc in next 8 sc , [5 sc in next ch-3 sp] 2 times, *sc in next 8 sc , (sc, ch 3 , sc) in next ch-3 sp, sc in next 8 sc , $[5 \mathrm{sc}$ in next ch-3 sp] 2 times; rep from $* 2$ times, sl st in first sc to join changing to $\mathrm{D}-112 \mathrm{sc}$ and $4 \mathrm{ch}-3 \mathrm{sps}$.
Rnd 11: Ch 1 , sk first 3 sc , trcl sh in next sc, sk next 3 sc , sc in next sc, sk next sc, (trcl, [ch 3, trcl] 3 times) in next ch-3 sp, sk next sc, sc in next sc, sk next 3 sc, trcl sh in next sc, sk next 3 sc , sc in next 10 sc, *sk next 3 sc , trcl sh in next sc, sk next 3 sc , sc in next sc, sk next sc, (trcl, [ch 3, trcl] 3 times) in next ch-3 sp, sk next sc, sc in next sc, sk next 3 sc, trcl sh in next sc, sk next 3 sc , sc in next 10 sc ; rep from * 2 times, sl st in first ch after
first trcl to join changing to B-48 sc, $12 \mathrm{ch}-3 \mathrm{sps}, 8$ trcl sh, and 16 trcl.

Rnds 13-14: Ch 1, sc around, working 3 sc in each corner-164 sts. Fasten off.

YARN Washable worsted-weight yarn (about 125 yd [115 m]; (640): red (F), cream (B), orange (D), purple (E), green (C).

HOOK Size J/10 ( 6 mm ). Adjust hook size if necessary to obtain correct gauge.
GAUGE 14 sts and 12 rows $=4$ " in sc; Rows $1-2$ of center $=31 / 2$ ".

## Stitch Guide

2 treble crochet cluster (2tr-cl): Yo 2 times,
insert hook in next st, yo and pull up lp, [yo and draw through 2 lps] 2 times (2 lps on hook), yo 2 times, insert hook in same st, yo and pull up lp, [yo and draw through 2 lps] 2 times, yo and draw through all 3 lps on hook.
3 treble crochet cluster (3tr-cl): Yo 2 times, insert hook in next st, yo and pull up lp, [yo and draw through 2 lps$] 2$ times ( 2 lps on hook), *[yo 2 times, insert hook in same st, yo and pull up lp, [yo and draw through 2 lps] 2 times; rep from *, yo and draw through 4 lps on hook.
Double treble crochet (dtr): Yo 3 times, insert hook in next st, yo and pull up lp, [yo and draw through 2 lps] 4 times.

## Square

Center: (RS) With F, ch 6, sl st in first ch to form ring.
Rnd 1: Ch 1 (does not count as st throughout), 16 sc in ring, sl st in first sc to join.
Rnd 2: Ch 4 (counts as tr), 2tr-cl (see Stitch Guide) in first sc, *ch 3, sk next sc, $3 \mathrm{tr}-\mathrm{cl}$ (see Stitch Guide) in next st; rep from * 6 more times, ch 3, sl st in top of 2 tr cl to join- 8 cl .
Rnd 3: Sl st in first 2 ch , ch 3 (counts as dc), ch 3, dc in center ch of next ch-3 sp, *ch 5, dtr (see Stitch Guide) in next $3 \mathrm{tr}-\mathrm{cl}$, ch 5 , dc in center ch of next ch-3 sp, ch 3, dc in center ch of next ch-3 sp; rep from * 2 more times, ch 5, dtr in $2 \mathrm{tr}-\mathrm{cl}$, ch 5 , sl st in top of beg ch 3 to join. Fasten off.

## Log cabin border: Log 1:

Row 1: With B, join with sc in any dtr of center, 5 sc in next ch-5 sp, sc in next dc, 3 sc in next ch-3 sp, sc in next dc, 5 sc in next ch-5 sp, sc in dtr, turn- 17 sc .
Row 2: Ch 1, sc in first st, sc flo to last st, sc in last st, turn.
Row 3: Rep Row 2 changing to $D$ in last st, do not turn, rotate square 90 degrees to the right.
Log 2:
Row 1: Ch 1, sc in next 3 row-ends of previous log, sc in dtr of center, 5 sc in next ch- 5 sp , sc in next dc, 3 sc in next ch-3 sp, sc in next dc, 5 sc in next ch-5 sp, sc in next dtr, turn-20 sc.
Rows 2-3: Rep Rows 2-3 of Log 1, changing to C in last st of Row 3-20 sc. Log 3:
Rep Log 2, changing to E in last st of Row 3, fasten off E , rotate work 90 degrees.

## $\log 4$ :

Row 1: Ch 1, sc in next 3 row-ends of previous log, sc in dtr of center, 5 sc in next ch- 5 sp , sc in next dc, 3 sc in next ch-3 sp, sc in next dc, 5 sc in next ch-5 $\mathrm{sp}, \mathrm{sc}$ in next dtr, sc in next 3 row-ends, turn-23 sc.
Rows 2-3: Rep Rows 2-3 of $\log 1$, changing to $D$ in last st of Row 3, fasten off E, rotate work 90 degrees.
$\log 5$ :
Row 1: Ch 1, sc in each row-end and sc flo in each st across, turn-23 sc.
Rows 2-3: Rep Rows 2-3 of $\log 1$, changing to $B$ in last st of Row 3—23 sc. Fasten off D.
Logs 6-15: Rep Log 5 working logs in colors as foll: $\log$ 6: B, $\log 7$ : E, $\log 8$ : C, $\log 9: B, \log 10: D, \log 11: C, \log$ 12: E, $\log 13: D, \log 14: B, \log 15: E$, changing to C in last st of $\log 15$.
Log 16: Rep Log 5, but do not change color in last st.
Fasten off and weave in loose ends.

## FINISHED SIZE 12" by 12 ".

YARN Washable worsted-weight yarn (about 140 yd [129 m]; (64B): cream (B) and red (F).

HOOK Size N/15 (9 mm). Adjust hook size if necessary to obtain correct gauge.
NOTIONS Stitch marker (m).
GAUGE $12^{1 ⁄ 2}$ sts and 11 rows $=4$ ".


## Notes

Square is worked as a spiral, do not join at end of rnd.

To carry a color, lay it over top 2 lps of sts being worked in and work st as usual, placing the carried color inside st being worked.

With tapestry crochet, 1 color is worked in sc, while another is carried. Colors are switched while 2 lps of st rem; yo with 2 nd color and pull it through the 2 lps .

Untwist yarn at end of each rnd.

## Square

With B, ch 4, sl st in first ch to form ring.
Rnd 1: 7 sc in ring carrying tail (see Notes), pull tail to tighten-7 sc.
Rnd 2: Cont to carry tail and beg to carry F, with B sc in first sc, 2 sc in next 6 sc , place marker ( pm ) in last sc to mark end of rnd- 13 sts.
Rnd 3: Cut tail, with B sc in next sc, [sc in next 2 sc , (sc, ch 2, sc) in next st] 4 times, pm in corner ch (move m up at end of each rnd) -17 sc and $4 \mathrm{ch}-2 \mathrm{sps}$.
Rnd 4: [With F sc in next sc, with B sc in next 3 sc , (sc, ch 2, sc) in corner ch-2 sp] 4 times- 24 sc and 4 ch-2 sps.
Rnd 5: [With B sc in next sc, with F sc in next 2 sc , with B sc in next 3 sc , (sc, ch 2 , sc) in corner ch-2 sp] 4 times- 32 sc and 4 ch-2 sps.

Rnd 6: [With B sc in next 2 sc, with F sc in next 3 sc , with B sc in next 3 sc , (sc, ch 2 , sc) in corner ch-2 sp] 4 times- 40 sc and 4 ch- 2 sps.
Rnd 7: [With B sc in next 2 sc, with F sc in next 5 sc , with B sc in next 3 sc , (sc, ch $2, \mathrm{sc}$ ) in corner ch-2 sp] 4 times- 78 sc and 4 ch-2 sps.
Rnd 8: [With B sc in next 3 sc, with F sc in next 6 sc , with B sc in next 3 sc , (sc, ch $2, \mathrm{sc}$ ) in corner ch-2 sp] 4 times- 56 sc and 4 ch- 2 sps.
Rnd 9: [With B sc in next 3 sc, with F sc in next 8 sc , with $B \mathrm{sc}$ in next 3 sc , (sc, ch 2 , sc) in corner ch-2 sp] 4 times- 64 sc and 4 ch-2 sps.
Rnd 10: [With B sc in next 4 sc , with $F$ sc in next 9 sc , with $B$ sc in next 3 sc , (sc, ch 2, sc) in corner ch-2 sp] 4 times- 72 sc and 4 ch-2 sps.
Rnd 11: [With B sc in next 4 sc , with $F$ sc in next 11 sc , with $B \mathrm{sc}$ in next 3 sc , ( $\mathrm{sc}, \mathrm{ch} 2, \mathrm{sc}$ ) in corner ch-2 sp] 4 times- 80 sc and $4 \mathrm{ch}-2 \mathrm{sps}$.
Rnd 12: [With B sc in next 5 sc, with $F$ sc in next 12 sc , with $B$ sc in next 3 sc , ( $\mathrm{sc}, \mathrm{ch} 2, \mathrm{sc}$ ) in corner ch-2 sp] 4 times- 88 sc and 4 ch-2 sps.
Rnd 13: [With B sc in next 7 sc , with $F$ sc in next 5 sc , with B sc in next sc, with F sc in next 5 sc , with B sc in next 4 sc , (sc, ch 2, sc) in corner ch-2 sp] 4 times- 96 sc and 4 ch-2 sps.
Rnd 14: [With B sc in next 9 sc, with F sc in next 4 sc , with B sc in next 2 sc , with $F$ sc in next 4 sc , with $B$ sc in next 5 sc , (sc, ch 2, sc) in corner ch-2 sp] 4 times-104 sc and 4 ch-2 sps.
Rnd 15: [With B sc in next 11 sc , with $F$ sc in next 3 sc , with $B \mathrm{sc}$ in next 3 sc , with $F$ sc in next 3 sc , with B sc in next 6 sc , (sc, ch 2, sc) in corner ch-2 sp] 4 times- 112 sc and $4 \mathrm{ch}-2 \mathrm{sps}$.
Rnd 16: [With B sc in next 28 sc , (sc, ch 2, sc) in corner ch-2 sp] 4 times- 120 sc and $4 \mathrm{ch}-2 \mathrm{sps}$.
Rnd 17: [With B sc in next 30 sc , (sc, ch $2, \mathrm{sc}$ ) in corner] 4 times, fasten off F, with B sl st in next st-128 sc and 4 ch-2 sps.
Fasten off B. Steam to block.

## Woven Threads

April Garwood

## FINISHED SIZE 12" by 12 ".

YARN Washable worsted-weight yarn; ((240)):
14 yd each of purple (E), green (C), orange (D), red (F), cream (B), and 45 yd blue (A).
HOOK Size H/8 (5 mm). Adjust hook size if necessary to obtain correct gauge.
NOTIONS Locking st markers (m); yarn needle.
GAUGE Each strip $=10$ " long, $13 / 4$ " wide.

## Square

Strip (make 12, 2 in each color): Ch 31.
Row 1: (RS) Sc in 5th ch from hook (skipped ch counts as ch 1 and hdc), ch 1 , dc in same ch, [sk next ch, (sc, ch $1, d c$ ) in next ch] 12 times, sk next ch, hdc in last ch, (ch 2, sc, ch 1, dc) in same ch, ch 2, turn to work along bottom ridge lp of foundation ch , hdc in first ch (same ch as last st worked), [sk next ch, (sc, ch 1, dc) in next ch] 13 times, sk next ch, (hdc, ch 2, sc, ch 1, dc) in last ch, ch 2 , sl st in top of beg ch to join, turn- 60 sts.
Row 2: Ch 1, *(hdc, ch 2, sc, ch 1, dc) in corner ch-2 sp, sk next st, (sc, ch 1, dc) in next ch-1 sp, sk next st, (sc, ch 1, dc, ch 2 , hdc) in next corner ch-2 sp, [sk 2 sts, (sc, ch 1, dc) in next ch-1 sp] 13 times; rep from *, sl st in beg hdc to join- 68 sts. Fasten off and weave in ends.

Join strips: With RS facing up, arrange 6 strips (one of each color) vertically side by side. With one of rem strips, weave across the bottom edge of the square formed by the 6 vertical strips by going [over the first strip, under the next one] across. With the next strip, weave right above the last one [under the first strip, over the next one] across. Weave each strip above the last one, but reversing the order of "over" and "under" from the strip below it in order to achieve a woven look. Secure edges of the adjacent strips tog with locking st markers or safety pins to hold them while edging is worked. Edging:
Rnd 1: Beg in upper-right corner of woven square and working through both thicknesses, join A with sl st in first ch-1 sp of vertical strip and corner ch-2 sp of horizontal strip, ch 3 (counts as dc), dc through same sps, *cont across side of square and working through both thicknesses, work 16 pairs of dc making sure to work in each row-end of vertical strips. At the end of the last vertical strip, 2 dc in next ch-2 sp of horizontal strip, ch 3, turn square 90 degrees, sk next st of now vertical strip and sk one st of now top horizontal strip, 2 dc in next ch-1 sp of vertical strip and corner ch-2 sp of horizontal strip; rep from * 3 times, omitting final 2 dc , sl st in top of beg ch-3 to join- 36 dc on each side, 144 dc . Rnd 2: Sk first dc, sl st bet first skipped dc and next dc, ch 3 (counts as dc), dc in same sp, [sk next $2 \mathrm{dc}, 2 \mathrm{dc}$ bet last skipped dc and next dc] 17 times, *(2 dc, ch $2,2 \mathrm{dc}$ ) in corner ch-3 sp, turn square 90 degrees to work along next side, sk first dc, 2 dc bet first skipped and next dc, [sk next $2 \mathrm{dc}, 2 \mathrm{dc}$ bet last skipped dc and next dc] 17 times; rep from * 2 times, (2 dc, ch 2, 2 dc ) in corner ch-3 sp, sl st in top beg ch-3 to join- 160 dc . Fasten off and weave in ends.

YARN Washable worsted-weight yarn; ((44)): purple (E), 23 yd; green (C), 23 yd; cream (B), 18 yd; blue (A), 35 yd.
HOOK Size I/9 ( 5.5 mm ). Adjust hook size if necessary to obtain correct gauge.
NOTIONS Yarn needle.
GAUGE First 3 rnds $=4$ " across.

## Stitch Guide

Beginning treble Cluster (BtrC): Ch 4, *yo
2 times, insert hook in indicated sp, yo
and pull up lp, [yo and draw through 2 lps
on hook] 2 times; rep from *, yo and draw through all 3 lps on hook.
Treble Cluster (trC): *Yo 2 times, insert hook in indicated sp, yo and pull up lp, [yo and draw through 2 lps on hook] 2 times; rep from * 2 times, yo and draw through all 4 lps on hook.
$V$-Stitch ( $V$-st): (Dc, ch 1, dc) in indicated st or sp.

## Square

With E, ch 4, sl st in first ch to form ring.
Rnd 1: (RS) BtrC (see Stitch Guide) in ring, ch 5, [trC (see Stitch Guide) in ring, ch 5] 4 times, sl st in BtrC to join- 5 cl . Fasten off E.
Rnd 2: With RS facing, join C with sl st in any ch-5 sp, ch 1,7 sc in each ch-5 sp
around, sl st in first sc to join- 35 sc .
Rnd 3: Ch 1 , sc in first $6 \mathrm{sc}, * 2 \mathrm{sc}$ in next sc, sc in next 6 sc ; rep from * 3 times, 2 sc in last sc, sl st in first sc to join-40 sc. Fasten off C.
Rnd 4: With RS facing, join B with sl st in any sc, ch 4 (counts as dc and ch 1 ), dc in same sc (beg V-st made), [sk next sc, V-st (see Stitch Guide) in next st] 19 times, sl st in 3rd ch of beg V-st to join- 20 V-sts. Fasten off B.
Rnd 5: With RS facing, join A with sc bet first 2 V -sts, [ch 2, sc bet next 2 V -sts] 19 times, ch 2, sl st in beg sc to join-20 ch-2 sps.
Rnd 6: Ch 1, sc in first sc, [(hdc, dc, hdc) in next ch-2 sp, sc in next sc] 19 times, (hdc, dc, hdc) in last ch-2 sp, sl st in beg sc to join-80 sts. Fasten off A.
Rnd 7: With RS facing, join E with sl st from back to front around post of any sc, ch 3 (counts as a BPdc), [BPhdc (see Glossary) around next hdc, BPsc (see Glossary) around next dc, BPhdc around next hdc, BPdc (see Glossary) around next sc] 19 times, BPhdc around next hdc, BPsc around next dc, BPhdc
around next hdc, sl st in top of beg ch-3 to join- 80 sts.
Rnd 8: Ch 3 (counts as dc), dc in next 8 sts, 2 dc in next st, [dc in next $9 \mathrm{sts}, 2 \mathrm{dc}$ in next st] 7 times, sl st in top of beg ch-3 to join- 88 dc . Fasten off E.
Rnd 9: With RS facing and working in blo, join C with sc in any dc in line with one of the points of Rnd 1 star, sc in next 6 dc , hdc in next 3 dc , dc in next dc, (dc, ch 5, dc) in next dc (corner made), [dc in next dc, hdc in next 3 dc , sc in next 13 dc , hdc in next 3 dc , dc in next dc, (dc, ch 5, dc) in next dc] 3 times, dc in next dc, hdc in next 3 dc , sc in next 6 dc , sl st in beg sc to join-92 sts and 4 ch- 5 sps.
Rnd 10: Ch 1, sc in first 2 sts, hdc in next 3 sts, dc in next 7 sts, $* 7$ dc in corner ch -5 sp , dc in next 7 sts, hdc in next 3 sts, sc in next 3 sts, hdc in next 3 sts, dc in next 7 dc ; rep from * 2 times, 7 dc in corner ch- 5 sp , dc in next 7 sts , hdc in next 3 sts, sc in next st, sl st in beg sc to join- 120 sts. Fasten off C.
Rnd 11: With RS facing, join B with sl st in 4th dc of any 7 -dc corner, ch 4,
(counts as dc and ch 1 ), (dc, ch $1, \mathrm{dc}$ ) in same dc (corner made), *[sk 2 sts, $V$-st in next st] 9 times, sk 2 sts ${ }^{* *}$, (dc, ch 1, dc, ch $1, \mathrm{dc}$ ) in next dc (corner made); rep from * around, ending last rep at ${ }^{* *}$, sl st in 3rd ch of beg ch-4 to join-36 V-sts and 4 (dc, ch $1, \mathrm{dc}, \mathrm{ch} 1, \mathrm{dc}$ ) corners. Fasten off B.
Rnd 12: With RS facing, join A with sc bet any corner and next V-st, *[ch 3, sc in next sp bet $V$-sts] 8 times, ch 3 , sc in sp bet V-st and next corner, ch $5^{* *}$, sc in sp bet corner and next V-st; rep from * around, ending last rep at ${ }^{* *}$, sl st in beg sc to join.
Rnd 13: Sl st in next ch-3 sp, ch 3
(counts as dc), 2 dc in same sp, *3 dc in each ch-3 sp to next corner ch-5 sp, ( 3 dc , ch $3,3 \mathrm{dc}$ ) in corner ch-5 sp; rep from * around, sl st in top of beg ch-3 to join- 132 dc .
Fasten off and weave in ends.

GAUGE First 3 rnds $=41 / 2^{\prime \prime}$ across.

## Square

## Satellites (make 4)

Rnd 1: (RS) With B, ch 4, sl st in beg ch to form ring, ch 3 (counts as dc), 13 dc in ring, sl st in top of beg ch-3 to join- 14 dc . Fasten off.
Rnd 2: With RS facing, join E with sl st in any dc, ch 1 , sc in same dc, $* 2$ sc in next dc, sc in next dc; rep from * to last dc, 2 sc in last dc, sl st in beg sc to join-21 sc. Fasten off leaving a $14^{\prime \prime}$ tail for seaming.

## Center spiral:

Rnd 1: (RS) With F and leaving long beg tail, ch 2, working over beg tail, (sc, hdc, 2 dc ) in 2 nd ch from hook, remove hook from lp and place marker ( pm ) in lp to hold st; *join D with sc in same ch, (hdc, 2 dc ) in same ch*, remove hook from lp and pm to hold st; with B, rep from * to *, do not remove hook from lp, pm to mark end of rnd- 12 sts. Pull tail to tighten.
Note: Subsequent rnds will start with the color used last on the previous rnd. Do not join and do not turn at end of rnds.

Do not fasten off any of the colors until Rnd 6 is complete. Change to next color by removing hook from lp of current color and pm to hold st. Then place dropped lp of next color back on hook.
Rnd 2: With B, *2 dc in each of next 4 sts*; with F, rep from * to ${ }^{*}$, with D , rep from * to *- 24 dc .
Rnd 3: With D, *[2 dc in next dc, dc in next dc] 4 times*; with B , rep from * to *, with F, rep from * to *-36 dc.
Rnd 4: With F, *[2 dc in next dc, dc in next 2 dc$] 4$ times*; with D , rep from * to *, with B, rep from * to *-48 dc.
Rnd 5: With B, *[2 dc in next dc, dc in next 3 dc 4 times*; with F, rep from * to *, with D , rep from * to *- 60 dc .
Rnd 6: With D, *[2 dc in next dc, dc in next 4 dc] 4 times*; with B, rep from * to *, with F, rep from * to *, ** with D, hdc in next dc, sc in next dc, sl st in next dc, fasten off $\mathrm{D}^{* *}$, with B , rep from ${ }^{* *}$ to ${ }^{* *}$, with F, rep from $* *$ to $* *-72$ sts.
Rnd 7: Join E with sc in first st of any color, sc in next 4 sts, *2 sc in next st, sc in next 5 sts; rep from * 11 times, 2 sc in last st, sl st in first sc to join- 84 sc .
Rnd 8: Ch 1, sc in first 8 sc , *ch 4, work around a satellite as foll: Sc in 5th sc from tail of satellite, sc in next 4 sc , 3 sc in next sc (corner made), sc in next 5 sc , ch 4 , sk rem satellite sts; resume work around center spiral, sk next 9 sc of spiral, sc in next 12 sc ; rep from * 3 times, end last rep with 4 sc (instead of 12 sc ), sl st in first sc to join- 100 sc and 8 ch-4 sps.
Using $14^{\prime \prime}$ satellite tails, sewing through blo, sew center 3 unworked satellite sts ( 1 sc , the joining sl st, and the next sc) to center 3 skipped spiral sts.
Rnd 9: Ch 1 , sc in first 8 sc , ${ }^{\text {scc }}$ in next ch-4 sp, sc in next $6 \mathrm{sc}, 3 \mathrm{sc}$ in next sc (corner), sc in next 6 sc , sc in next ch-4 sp , sc in next 12 sc ; rep from $* 3$ times, end last rep with 4 sc (instead of 12 sc ), sl st in beg sc to join- 116 sc.
Rnd 10: Ch 2 (counts as hdc), hdc in next 7 sc , *hdc2tog (see Glossary), sc in next $6 \mathrm{sc}, 3 \mathrm{sc}$ in next sc (corner made), sc in next $6 \mathrm{sc}, \mathrm{hdc} 2 \mathrm{tog}$, hdc in next 12 sc; rep from * 3 times, end last rep with 4 hdc (instead of 12 hdc ), sl st in top of beg ch-2 to join- 116 sts.
Rnd 11: Ch 3 (counts as dc), *dc in
each st to next 3 -sc corner, dc in next sc, ( 2 dc , ch $2,2 \mathrm{dc}$ ) in next sc (corner made); rep from * 3 times; dc in each st around, sl st in top of beg ch-3-128 dc and 4 corner ch-2 sps.
Rnd 12: Ch 1, sc in in each dc around, working 3 sc in each ch-2 corner sp, sl st in first sc to join- 140 dc .
Fasten off and weave in ends.

NOTIONS Yarn needle.
GAUGE First 4 rnds $=41 / 2$ " across.

## Notes

The chains of Rnds 3 and 7 are intertwined around the chains of Rnds 2 and 6 respectively. Carefully draw the working yarn through the ch-sps.

Square
Rnd 1: (RS) With A, ch 4, sl st in first ch
to form ring, ch 2 (counts as dc), 11 dc in ring, sl st in top of beg ch-2 to join- 12 dc. Fasten off A.

Rnd 2: Cut a 4-yd length of C. With RS facing, join C with sl st in any dc, [ch 12 , sk next 3 dc , sl st in next dc] 3 times, working last sl st in same st as beg ch- 3 ch- 12 sps.
Note: Work sts of Rnd 3 in sts of Rnd 1.
Carefully draw the working yarn
through the ch-sps of the previous rnd as you work (see Notes).
Rnd 3: Working in front of first ch-sp and keeping hook to the front of piece and yarn to the back, sl st in next 2 dc , * carefully remove hook from st, take hook behind the ch-sp and reinsert hook in dropped st, pull the working yarn tail through the ch-sp, ch 12 , sk next 3 sts; working in front of next ch-sp, sl st in next dc; rep from * 2 times- 3 ch- 12 sps (for a total of 6 intertwined ch-12 sps). Fasten off C.
Rnd 4: With RS facing, join B with sl st in any ch- 12 sp , ch $1,2 \mathrm{sc}$ in same sp, [ch 6,2 sc in next ch- 12 sp] 5 times, ch $6, \mathrm{sl}$ st in beg ch- 1 to join- 6 ch- 6 sps and 12 sc
Rnd 5: Ch 1, [sc in next 2 sc , (hdc, 2 dc , $\mathrm{tr}, 2 \mathrm{dc}, \mathrm{hdc}$ ) in next ch-6 sp] 6 times, sl st in beg ch-1 to join- 54 sts. Fasten off B.
Rnd 6: Cut a $10-\mathrm{yd}$ length of C. With RS facing, join C with sl st in first sc, [ch 20, sk next 8 sts, sl st in next sc] 6 times, working last sl st in same st as beg ch-6 ch-20 sps.
Note: Work sts of Rnd 7 in sts of Rnd 5. as for Rnd 3 (see Notes).
Rnd 7: Working in front of first ch-sp and keeping hook to the front of the piece and yarn to the back, sl st in next 5 sts, *carefully remove hook from st, take hook behind the ch-sp and reinsert hook in dropped st, pull the working yarn tail through the ch-sp, ch 18 , sk next 8 sts, working in front of next ch-sp, sl st in next st; rep from * 5 times- $6 \mathrm{ch}-18 \mathrm{sps}$ (for a total of $12 \mathrm{ch}-\mathrm{sps}$ ). Fasten off C.
Rnd 8: With RS facing, join B with sl st in any ch -20 sp , ch $1,2 \mathrm{sc}$ in same sp , [ch 6, 2 sc in next ch-sp] 11 times, ch 6, sl st in beg ch- 1 to join- 12 ch- 6 sps and 24 sc.
Rnd 9: Ch 1, [sc in next 2 sc , (hdc, 2 dc , $\mathrm{tr}, 2 \mathrm{dc}, \mathrm{hdc}$ ) in next ch- 12 sp$] 12$ times, sl st in beg ch-1 to join-108 sts.

Rnd 10: Sl st in next 6 sts, ch 1, sc in same st, $*[$ ch 10 , sk next 8 sts, sc in next st] 2 times, ch 14 , sk next 8 sts**, sc in next st (corner made); rep from * around, ending last rep at ${ }^{* *}$, sl st in beg ch- 1 to join- 8 ch- 10 sps and 4 corner ch-14 sps.
Rnd 11: Ch 2, *[10 dc in next ch-10 sp, dc in next sc] 2 times, ( 6 dc , ch 1 , dc, ch 3 , dc, ch $1,6 \mathrm{dc}$ ) in next corner ch-14 $\mathrm{sp}^{* *}$, dc in next sc; rep from * around, ending last rep at ${ }^{* *}$, sl st in top of beg ch-2 to join- $148 \mathrm{dc}, 4 \mathrm{ch}-3 \mathrm{sps}$, and 8 ch-1 sps. Fasten off B.
Rnd 12: Join C with sl st in 4th dc of first 10-dc group, ch 1, sc in same dc, sc in next 3 dc , ch 7 , sk next 7 sts, sc in next 4 dc , ch 7 , sk next 7 sts , dc in next 3 dc, *sk next ch-1 sp and dc, ch 2 , (tr, $^{\text {s }}$ ch 3 , tr , ch $3, \mathrm{tr}$ ) in next ch -3 sp , ch 2 , sk next dc and next ch-1 sp, dc in next $3 \mathrm{dc} * *$, [ch 7 , sk next 7 dc , sc in next 4 sts] 2 times, ch 7 , sk next 7 dc , dc in next 3 dc ; rep from * around, end last rep at **, ch 7, sk next 7 sts, sl st in beg ch-1 to join.
Fasten off and weave in ends.

HOOK Sizes F/5 ( 3.75 mm ) and G/6 ( 4 mm ). Adjust hook size if necessary to obtain correct gauge.
NOTIONS St marker ( m ); yarn needle. GAUGE 15 sts $=4$ " and 10 rows $=3^{1 / 2} 2^{\prime \prime}$ in patt with smaller hook.

## Notes

Patt is based on a multiple of 6 sts +1 .
Use larger hook for foundation ch only.
Join each new color by inserting hook in specified st and pulling up a lp leaving a $6 "$ tail. Unless otherwise specified, end each row by cutting yarn leaving a $6^{\prime \prime}$ tail and pulling tail through the lp to fasten off.

Unless otherwise specified, do not turn.

## Stitch Guide

Beginning double crochet 2 together (beg dc2tog): Ch 2, sk first st, dc in next st-1 st dec'd. Treble crochet 3 together (tr3tog): *Yo 2 times, insert hook in next st, yo and pull up lp, [yo and draw through 2 lps on hook] 2 times; rep from * 2 times, yo and pull through all 4 lps on hook-2 sts dec'd.

## Square

With D and larger hook, ch 45.
Row 1: (RS) Change to smaller hook,
3 tr in 4th ch from hook, (3 skipped chs count as dc) [dc in next ch, hdc in next ch, sc in next ch, hdc in next ch, dc in next ch, 3 tr in next ch] 7 times omitting final 3 tr at end of last rep- 57 sts. Fasten off (see Notes). Place marker (pm) to indicate RS.
Row 2: (RS) Join E in top of Row 1 beg ch-3, ch 1 , sc in same st, sc in next tr, [ 3 sc in next tr (middle tr), sc in next 2 sts, sc3tog (see Glossary), sc in next 2 sts] 7 times placing last 2 sc of final rep in same st- 58 sts.
Row 3: (RS) Join D in first sc of Row 2, beg dc2tog (see Stitch Guide), [hdc in next st, sc in next st, hdc in next st, dc in next st, tr3tog (see Stitch Guide), dc in next st] 7 times- 43 sts.
Row 4: (RS) Join B in beg dc2tog (not the top of the ch 2 ) of Row 3, ch 1 , sc in same st, sc in each st across, turn. Do not fasten off.
Row 5: (WS) Ch 1, sc across, turn. Fasten off.


Row 6: (RS) Join D in last sc of Row 5, ch 3 (counts as dc), [hdc in next sc, sc in next sc, hdc in next sc, dc in next sc, 3 tr in next sc, dc in next sc] 7 times- 57 sts. Row 7: (RS) Join E in top of beg ch-3 at beg Row 6, ch 1, 2 sc in same st, [sc3tog, sc in next 2 sts, 3 sc in next st, sc in next 2 sts] 7 times- 58 sts.

Row 8: (RS) Join D in first sc of Row 7, ch 3 (counts as dc), [tr3tog, dc in next st, hdc in next st, sc in next st, hdc in next st, dc in next st] 6 times, tr3tog, dc in next st, hdc in next st, sc in next st, hdc in next st, dc2tog (see Glossary) —43 sts. Row 9: (RS) Join B in top of beg ch-3 of Row 8, ch 1 , sc in same st, sc in each st
across, turn. Do not fasten off.
Row 10: (WS) Ch 1, sc across, turn. Fasten off.
Row 11: (RS) Join C in last sc of Row 10, ch 3 (counts as dc), [ 3 tr in next sc, dc in next sc, hdc in next sc, sc in next sc, hdc in next sc, dc in next sc] 7 times- 57 sts.
Rows 12-31: Rep Rows 2-11 two times, foll color sequence as shown in photo.
Rows 32-33: Rep Rows 2-3.
Edging: With RS facing, join E in any st of Row 33, ch 1 , sc in same st, sc to last st (corner), 3 sc in corner, work 41 sc evenly along side, 3 sc in corner, work 41 sc evenly along the bottom, 3 sc in corner, work 41 sc evenly along the other side, 3 sc in corner, sc in each rem st along top row, sl st in beg ch-1 to join- 176 sc . Fasten off and weave in ends.

## Snow at Midnight

 Marion BraumFINISHED SIZE 12" by 12 ".
YARN Washable worsted-weight yarn; (640)): purple (E), 100 yd ; cream (B), 50 yd .
HOOK Size J/10 ( 6 mm ). Adjust hook size if necessary to obtain correct gauge.
NOTIONS Yarn needle; st marker (m),
optional.
GAUGE 12 sts and 6 rows $=4$ " in dc.

## Notes

Work alternates between E rnds and B rnds. All B sts are worked in sts of previous B rnd. Most E sts are worked in sts of previous E rnd. In Rnd 11, E sts are also worked in some B sts.

The E rnds form the background and the B rnds form the foreground/snowflake.

Always work B sts in front of the E background. Most E sts are worked behind the B foreground. Only when instructed, work E sts over B ch-sps to form the snowflake.

When changing color, drop old color from hook but do not cut yarn. Place dropped lp of other color on hook and proceed. Unless otherwise instructed, drop E to WS and B to RS. You may wish to elongate the dropped lp or use a st m to ensure the last st does not ravel while working with the other color.

## Square

Rnd 1: With E, ch 4, sl st in first ch to form ring, ch 4 (counts as tr throughout) [(3 dc, tr) in ring] 3 times, 3 dc in ring, sl st in top of beg ch-4 to join- 16 sts.
Rnd 2: With B, ch 12, thread beg tail onto yarn needle and weave ch under
last $E d c$, then over and under $E$ sts around, sl st in first ch to form ring.
Rnd 3: Ch 5, [sl st in B ring in next place B ch is over E, ch 5] 7 times, sl st in beg sl st to join- 8 ch- 5 sps .
Rnd 4: With E, ch 4, dc in same st as join, [dc in next $3 \mathrm{dc},(\mathrm{dc}, \mathrm{tr}, \mathrm{dc})$ in next tr] 3 times, dc in next 3 dc , dc in same st as beg, sl st in top of beg ch-4 to join- 1 tr in each corner, 5 dc on each side. Drop E to RS. Note: When working next rnd, keep lp of $E$ and attached yarn on RS.
Rnd 5: With B, sl st in next 3 ch of first ch- 5 sp , [ch 5 , sl st in next ch-5 sp, ch 7, sl st in next ch-5 sp] 4 times, working last sl st in base of beg ch-5 to join- 4 ch-5 sps and 4 ch- 7 sps.
Rnd 6: With E, ch 4, dc in same st as join, [dc in next 2 dc ; working over next B ch-5 sp; dc in next dc, dc in next 2 dc , dc in corner tr, working over next B ch-7 $\mathrm{sp} \operatorname{tr}$ in same tr , dc in same tr$] 3$ times, dc in next 2 dc , working over next B ch-5 sp dc in next dc, dc in next 2 dc , dc in same st as beg, sl st in top of beg ch to join- 1 tr in each corner, 7 dc on each side. Drop E to RS. Note: In foll rnds, some B sts are worked on either side of an enclosing $E$ st. An enclosing $E$ st is an E st that was worked over a B st in a previous rnd.
Rnd 7: With B, sl st in next ch, sc in same ch-5 sp on this side of next enclosing E dc, *ch 3 , sc in same ch-5 sp on other side of same E dc , ch 7 , sc in next ch-7 sp on this side of next enclosing E tr, ch 5, sc in same ch-7 sp on other side of same E tr, ch 7, sc in next ch-5 sp on this side of next enclosing E dc; rep from * 3 times omitting last sc, sl st in first sc to join-4 ch-3 sps, 4 ch- 5 sps, 8 ch- 7 sps .
Rnd 8: With E, ch 4, dc in same st as join, [dc in next $7 \mathrm{dc}, \mathrm{dc}$ in corner tr, working over next B ch- 5 sp tr in same tr , dc in same tr] 3 times, dc in next 7 dc , dc in same st as beg, sl st in top of beg ch-1 tr in each corner, 9 dc on each side.
Rnd 9: With E, ch 4, dc in same st as join, *dc in next 2 dc , working over next B ch-7 sp, dc in next dc, dc in next 3 dc , working over next B ch-7 sp dc in next $\mathrm{dc}, \mathrm{dc}$ in next 2 dc , (dc, tr, dc) in corner tr; rep from * 2 times, dc in next 2 dc , working over next B ch-7 sp dc in next
dc , dc in next 3 dc , working over next B ch-7 sp dc in next dc, dc in next 2 dc , dc in same st as beg, sl st in top of beg ch- 1 tr in each corner, 11 dc on each side.
Rnd 10: With B, turn, sl st in last 3 ch of last rnd, turn, *ch 2, tr in next ch-3 sp , ch 2 , sc in next ch-7 sp this side of next enclosing E dc, ch 9, dc2tog (see Glossary) placing first leg in next ch-5 sp this side of next enclosing E corner tr, and last leg in same ch-5 sp on the other side of same E corner tr, ch 9, sc in next ch-7 sp on other side of next enclosing E dc; rep from * 2 times, ch 2, tr in next ch-3 sp, ch 2 , sc in next ch-7 sp this side of Edc , ch 9 , dc2tog placing first leg in next ch-5 sp this side of next enclosing E corner tr and last leg in same ch-5 sp on the other side of the same E corner tr , ch 9 , sl st in 3 rd sl st at beg of rnd to join- 8 ch- 2 sps, 8 ch- 9 sps.
Rnd 11: With E, ch 4, dc in same st as join, *dc in next dc, working over next B ch-9 sp dc in next dc, dc in same B ch-9 sp, dc in next 3 dc , FPdc around next B tr, sk next dc, dc in next 3 dc , dc in next B ch-9 sp, working over same $B$ ch -9 sp dc in next dc , dc in next dc, (dc, tr, dc) in corner tr; rep from * 2 times, dc in next dc, working over next B ch-9 sp dc in next dc, dc in same B ch-9 sp, dc in next 3 dc , FPdc (see Glossary) around next B tr, sk next dc, dc in next 3 dc , dc in next B ch-9 sp, working over same B ch-9 sp dc in next dc, dc in next dc, dc in same st as beg, sl st in top of beg ch to join- 1 tr in each corner, 15 dc on each side.
Rnd 12: With B, ch 2, dc in ch-2 sp on other side of next E FPdc, *ch 5, sc in next ch-9 sp this side of next enclosing E 2-dc group, ch 7, tr in next dc, ch 7, sc in next ch-9 sp on other side of next enclosing E 2-dc group, ch 5, dc2tog placing first leg in ch-2 sp on this side of next E FPdc and 2nd leg in ch-2 sp on the other side of the same E FPdc; rep from $* 2$ times, ch 5 , sc in next ch-9 sp on this side of next enclosing E 2-dc group, ch 7 , tr in next dc, ch 7 , sc in next ch-9 sp on other side of next enclosing A 2-dc-group, ch 5, sl st in first dc to join- 8 ch- $5 \mathrm{sps}, 8$ ch- 7 sps . Fasten off. Rnd 13: With E, ch 4, dc in same st as join, *dc in next $15 \mathrm{dc},(\mathrm{dc}, \mathrm{tr}, \mathrm{dc})$ in corner tr; rep from * 2 times, dc in next
$15 \mathrm{dc}, \mathrm{dc}$ in same st as beg, sl st in top of beg ch to join- 1 tr in each corner, 17 dc on each side.
Rnd 14: Ch 4, dc in same st as join, *dc in next dc, working over next B ch-7 sp 2 dc in next dc, dc in next 4 dc , working over next B ch-5 sp 2 dc in next dc, dc in next 3 dc , working over next B ch-5 sp 2 dc in next $\mathrm{dc}, \mathrm{dc}$ in next 4 dc , working over next B ch-7 sp 2 dc in next dc, dc

Rnds 15-16: Ch 4, dc in same st as join, [dc in each dc to next corner tr, (dc, tr, dc) in corner $\operatorname{tr}] 3$ times, dc in each dc around, dc in same st as beg, sl st in top of beg ch to join- 1 tr in each corner, 27 dc on each side.
Fasten off and weave in ends.

Fasten off C.
Rnd 7: Join D in any corner ch-3 sp, (ch 3, dc, ch 2, 2 dc ) in same sp (corner made), *[dc in next st, FPtr (see Glossary) around post of next st] 9 times, dc in next st**, ( 2 dc , ch $2,2 \mathrm{dc}$ ) in corner $\mathrm{sp}^{*}$; rep from * to * 2 times, rep from * to ${ }^{* *}$, sl st in top of beg ch-3 to join- 23 sts, one ch-2 corner per side. Fasten off D.
Rnd 8: Join C in any ch-2 sp of corner, (ch 3, dc, ch $2,2 \mathrm{dc}$ ) in same sp, *dc in next 23 sts, ( 2 dc , ch 2, 2 dc ) in ch-2 sp; rep from $* 2$ times, dc in next 23 sts, sl st in top of beg ch-3 to join- $27 \mathrm{dc}, 1 \mathrm{ch}-2$ sp corner per side. Fasten off C.
Rnd 9: Join D in any ch-2 sp of corner, (ch 3, dc, ch 2, 2 dc) in same sp, *dc in next 7 sts, [FPdtr (see Glossary) around post of next FPtr from Row 7, dc in next 3 sts] 4 times, dc in next 4 sts**, (2 dc, ch $2,2 \mathrm{dc}$ ) in corner ch- 2 sp ; rep from * to $* 2$ times, rep from * to ${ }^{* *}$, sl st in top of beg ch-3 to join- $31 \mathrm{sts}, 1$ ch-2 sp per side.
Rnd 10: Cont with D, ch 1, sc in same st, sc in next st, $* 3 \mathrm{sc}$ in corner ch- 2 sp , sc in next 31 sts; rep from * 2 times, sc in next 29 sts, sl st in first sc to join- 136 sc. Fasten off D.

Rnd 11: Join F in any corner st, ch 1 , *3 hdc in corner st, hdc in next 33 sts; rep from $* 3$ times, sl st in first hdc to join-144 hdc.
Rnd 12: Cont with F, ch 3, *4 dc in next st, dc in next 35 sts; rep from * around, sl st in top of beg ch-3 to join- 156 dc . Fasten off. Weave in ends.
Block square to finished measurements.

YARN Washable worsted-weight yarn; (34): red (F), 40 yd; blue (A), 28 yd; purple (E), 15 yd. HOOK J/10 ( 6 mm ). Adjust hook size if necessary to obtain correct gauge.


NOTIONS Yarn needle; st markers ( m ). GAUGE 14 sts and 7 rows $=4$ " in dc.

## Notes

Do not turn piece throughout.
Blocking is essential for this project to transform it into a proportioned piece.

## Stitch Guide

Dc4tog: [Yo, insert hook in next st, yo and pull up a lp, yo, draw through 2 lps$] 4$ times, yo, draw through all lps on hook.

## Square

With F, ch 6, sl st in beg ch to form ring.

Rnd 3: Ch 2 (does not count as dc), dc2tog (see Glossary) over next $2 \mathrm{ch},[* 2$ dc in each of next $2 \mathrm{ch}, 4 \mathrm{dc}$ in next ch, 2 dc in each of next $2 \mathrm{ch} * *$, dc4tog (see Glossary) over next 4 sts] 3 times; rep from * to ${ }^{* *}$, dc in next ch, sl st in top of first dc to join-54 dc.
Rnd 4: Sl st in next 3 sts, [ch 8 loosely, sk next 5 sts, sl st in next st, ch 8 loosely, sk next 6 sts, sl st in next st] 4 times- 8 ch- 8 sps.
Rnd 5: Ch 2, dc 2 tog over next $2 \mathrm{ch},[* 2$ dc in next $2 \mathrm{ch}, 4 \mathrm{dc}$ in next ch, 2 dc in next 2 ch**, dc4tog (see Stitch Guide) over next 4 sts] 7 times; rep from * to **, dc in next ch, sl st in top of first st to join-106 dc. Fasten off F.
Rnd 6: Join A with sl st in 4th st after join, [*ch 8 loosely, sk next 5 sts, sl st in next st, ch 8 loosely ${ }^{* *}$, sk next 6 sts, sl st in next st] 7 times; rep from * to ${ }^{* *}$, sk next 7 sts, sl st in first sl st to join- 16 ch-8 sps.

Rnd 8: Join F with sl st in 3rd st after Rnd 7 join, ch 1 (counts as sc), sc in next 2 sts, ch 4 , sk 4 sts, dc in next 3 sts, [ ${ }^{*}$ ch 4 , sk next 4 sts, tr in next st, ch 2 , tr in next st (corner made), ch 2, tr in same st, ch 2 , tr in next st, ch 4 , sk next 4 sts, dc in next 3 sts, ch 4 , sk next 4 sts**, sc in next 3 sts, ch 4 , sk next 4 sts, dc in next 3 sts] 3 times; rep from * to ${ }^{* *}$, sl st in beg ch-1 to join- $12 \mathrm{sc}, 24 \mathrm{dc}, 16 \mathrm{tr}$, 16 ch -4 sps, 12 ch- 2 sps. Fasten off F.
Rnd 9: Join E with sl st in any corner sp, ch 2 (counts as dc), 4 dc in same sp, place marker ( pm ) in $3 \mathrm{rd} \mathrm{dc}, 3 \mathrm{dc}$ in next ch-2 sp, *[4 sc in next ch-4 sp, sc in next 3 sts$] 3$ times, 4 sc in next ch- $4 \mathrm{sp}, 3$ dc in next ch-2 sp,** 5 dc in next ch-2 sp ( pm in 3 rd dc ), 3 dc in next ch-2 $\mathrm{sp}{ }^{* * *}$; rep from * to $* * * 2$ times, rep from * to ** 1 time, sl st in top of beg ch-2 to join-100 sc, 44 dc . Fasten off E.
Rnd 10: Join A with sl st in any st along side, ch 2 (counts as dc), dc in each st along sides, 5 dc in each marked st, sl st
in top of beg ch-2 to join- 160 dc . Fasten off and weave in ends.

## Notes

Square is made up of 5 separate pieces, which are interwoven and finished with a border. An opening is left in each piece when it is worked and, once each piece has been put into place, the ends of the opening are sewn tog.

## Inner Square

With D, ch 82 loosely.
Row 1: (RS) Dc in 4th ch from hook and in next 14 ch , 4 dc in next ch, dc in next 19 ch$] 3$ times, 4 dc in next ch, dc in next 3 ch , turn- 92 dc .
Row 2: (WS) Ch 3 (counts as dc throughout), dc in next 4 dc , [4 dc in next dc, dc in next 22 dc$] 3$ times, 4 dc in next dc, dc in next 17 dc, turn-104 dc.

Row 3: Ch 3, dc in next 18 dc , [4 dc in next dc, dc in next 25 dc$] 3$ times, 4 dc in next dc, dc in next 6 dc- 116 dc. Fasten off, leaving a $9^{\prime \prime}$ tail for sewing ends tog.

## Wide Rectangle (make 2)

With E, ch 82 loosely.
Row 1: (RS) Dc in 4th ch from hook and in next $23 \mathrm{ch}, 4 \mathrm{dc}$ in next ch, dc in next $10 \mathrm{ch}, 4 \mathrm{dc}$ in next ch, dc in next 28 ch , 4 dc in next ch, dc in next $10 \mathrm{ch}, 4 \mathrm{dc}$ in next ch, dc in next 3 ch , turn- 92 dc .
Row 2: Ch 3, dc in next $4 \mathrm{dc}, 4 \mathrm{dc}$ in next dc, dc in next $13 \mathrm{dc}, 4 \mathrm{dc}$ in next dc , dc in next $31 \mathrm{dc}, 4 \mathrm{dc}$ in next dc , dc in next $13 \mathrm{dc}, 4 \mathrm{dc}$ in next dc , dc in next 26 dc , turn- 104 dc .
Row 3: Ch 3, dc in next $27 \mathrm{dc}, 4 \mathrm{dc}$ in next dc, dc in next $16 \mathrm{dc}, 4 \mathrm{dc}$ in next dc , dc in next $34 \mathrm{dc}, 4 \mathrm{dc}$ in next dc , dc in next $16 \mathrm{dc}, 4 \mathrm{dc}$ in next dc , dc in next $6 \mathrm{dc}-116 \mathrm{dc}$. Fasten off, leaving a $9^{\prime \prime}$ tail for sewing ends tog.

## Narrow Rectangle (make 2)

With A, ch 82 loosely.
Row 1: (RS) Dc in 4th ch from hook and next 32 ch, 4 dc in next ch, dc in next ch, 4 dc in next ch, dc in next $37 \mathrm{ch}, 4$ dc in next ch, dc in next ch, 4 dc in next
ch, dc in next 3 ch , turn- 92 dc .
Row 2: Ch 3, dc in next $4 \mathrm{dc}, 4 \mathrm{dc}$ in next dc, dc in next $4 \mathrm{dc}, 4 \mathrm{dc}$ in next dc , dc in next $40 \mathrm{dc}, 4 \mathrm{dc}$ in next dc , dc in next $4 \mathrm{dc}, 4 \mathrm{dc}$ in next dc , dc in next 35 dc, turn-104 dc.
Row 3: Ch 3, dc in next $36 \mathrm{dc}, 4 \mathrm{dc}$ in next dc, dc in next $7 \mathrm{dc}, 4 \mathrm{dc}$ in next dc , dc in next $43 \mathrm{dc}, 4 \mathrm{dc}$ in next dc , dc in next $7 \mathrm{dc}, 4 \mathrm{dc}$ in next dc , dc in next 6 dc-116 dc. Fasten off, leaving a $9^{\prime \prime}$ tail for sewing ends tog.

## Assembly

Use tail of inner square to sew the final dc of each row to the ch-3 at the beg of each row. Position first wide rectangle in the inner square as shown in the left diagram in Fig 1. Use tail to sew ends tog. Position 2nd wide rectangle as shown in the right diagram in Fig 1. Use tail to sew ends tog. Weave each of the narrow rectangles over and under the sewn rectangles as shown in Fig 2. Use tail of each narrow rectangle to sew ends tog.

## Border

Note: To sc in the corner of a rectangle, work the sc bet the center 2 sts of the corner 4-dc from last row.
Rnd 1: With RS facing and B, join yarn with [sc in next corner of inner square, ch $6, \mathrm{sc}$ in the next corner of wide rectangle, ch 6 , sc in next corner of narrow rectangle, ch 13 , sc in the next corner of narrow rectangle, ch 6, sc in next corner of wide rectangle, ch 6] 4 times, sl st in first sc to join.
Rnd 2: Ch 2 (does not count as st), [dc in next 20 sts, 4 dc in next st, dc in next 21 sts] 4 times working last st over beg ch-2, sl st in first de to join.
Rnd 3: Ch 2, [dc in next $21 \mathrm{dc}, 4 \mathrm{dc}$ in next dc, dc in next 23 dc 4 times working last st over beg ch-2, sl st in first dc to join. Fasten off and weave in ends.

sl st in 2 nd ch of beg ch-4 to join- 32 ch-2 sps.
Rnd 7: Sl st in first ch-2 sp, ch 1, (2 sc, ch 1,2 sc) in same sp, *2 sc in next 7 ch-2 sps, ( 2 sc, ch 1, 2 sc) in next ch-2 sp; rep from $* 2$ times, 2 sc in next 7 ch-2 sps, sl st in first sc to join- 72 sts and 4 ch-1 sps. Fasten off A.
Rnd 8: Join E in st after joining st of Rnd 7 , sl st in corner ch-1, ch 3 (counts as dc throughout), (dc, ch 2, 2 dc) in same ch-1 sp for corner, $*$ dc in next 3 sts, hdc in next 2 sts , sc in next 8 sts , hdc in next 2 sts , dc in next 3 sts , ( 2 dc , ch 2,

Rnd 9: Join C in st after joining st of Rnd 8, sl st in corner ch-2 sp, (ch 1, sc, ch 3 , sc) in same ch-2 sp, ${ }^{*}$ [ch 3 , sk 2 sts, sc in next st] 7 times, ch 3 , (sc, ch 3, sc) in ch-2 sp; rep from * 2 times, [ch 3, sk 2 sts, sc in next sc] 7 times, ch 3 , sl st in first sc to join- 36 ch-3 sps.
Rnd 10: Sl st in corner sp, ch 1, [large sh in corner ch-3 sp, small sh (see Stitch Guide) in next 8 ch-3 sps 4 times, sl st in first sc to join- 116 sts.
Rnd 11: Sl st in first 2 sts, ch 1,3 sc in same st, *ch 1, sk 2 sts, [hdc in next st, sc in next st, ch 1 , sk next st] 8 times, hdc in next st, ch 1 , sk next st, 3 sc in next st; rep from * 2 times, ch 1, sk 2 sts, [hdc in next st, sc in next st, ch 1 , sk next st] 8 times, hdc in next st, ch 1, sk next st,
sl st in first sc to join- 80 sts and 40 ch-1 sps. Fasten off C.
Rnd 12: Join B in center st of 3 -sc corner, (ch 3, dc, ch 2, 2 dc) in same corner st, *[2 dc in ch-1 sp, sk next st, dc in next sc] 9 times, ( 2 dc ch 2, 2 dc ) in center sc of 3 -sc corner; rep from * 2 times, [2 dc in ch-1 sp, sk next st, dc in sc] 9 times, sl st in top of beg ch-3. Fasten off B.
Rnd 13: Join color E in st after joining st of Rnd 12 , sl st in ch-2 corner sp, ch 5 (counts as dc and ch 2), dc in same sp, *[ch 1, sk next st, dc in next st] 15 times, ch 1 , (dc, ch 2, dc) in ch-2 sp; rep from * 2 times, [ch 1, sk next st, dc in next st] 15 times, ch 1 , sl st in 3rd ch of beg ch- 5 to join. Fasten off and weave in ends.

If you have all the issues (Summer 2010-Spring 2011), you have patterns for all twenty squares (plus three bonus squares). Or select a single square and work it in a variety of colors. Or make Lisa Naskrent's Ribbon Square (CrochetMe.com) in the colors of your chosen cause. You'll find lots of tips on techniques and ideas for making your own designs in Series 700 of Knitting Daily TV (check www .knittingdaily.com/blogs/kdtv_series_500/content/KDTV Schedule.aspx for information about local airing). And join our Crochet-Along on Crochet Me for tips and techniques from Crochet $M e$ readers.

#### Abstract

Getting Started FINISHED SIZE about 62" $\times 50$ " YARN Washable worsted-weight yarn (about 200 yd [83 m]; (40)): red (F), blue (A), green (C), orange (D), purple (E), 1 skein each. HOOK: H/8 ( 5 mm ). Adjust hook size if necessary to obtain correct gauge. NOTIONS: Yarn needle. GAUGE $12 \mathrm{sc}=4^{\prime \prime}$.


$\square$
Use yarn color of the darker square of the 2 that you are joining.
Many of the squares match up st-for-st. For a square that has more sts than the other, hold square with more sts in the back and work 2 sts tog as foll: Sl st through sts of both squares, insert hook through same st on front square, and through next st on back square, yo and work sl st. With sl st joining method, cont working around sides of first square, adding squares as you go, without cutting yarn.
Adjust hook size as necessary for a smooth seam. If seams are too tight, move up a hook size; if they are too loose, move down a hook size.
Arrange the squares as we have or choose your own arrangement.

## Pattern

## JOINING SQUARES

With squares RS tog, join yarn in blo of corner sts. Sl st blo through both thicknesses along sides of squares. Cont joining squares until all are joined. Fasten off and weave in ends. Note: For yarn ends at edge of afghan, work over them when working the first round of the border.

## BORDER

Rnd 1: With A, join yarn in any corner st, sc around; sl st in first sc to join. Fasten off A.
Note: For squares that have more edge sts, work an occasional sc2tog (see Glossary).
Rnd 2: Sk 8 sc , join A in next sc , sc in same st as join, sc in next st, ch 9, drop yarn from hook; join C in next st, working in front of A strand, sc in same st as join, sc in next st, ch 9 , drop yarn from hook; join $D$ in next st, working in front of $A$ and $C$ strand, sc in same st as join, sc in next sc, ch 9, drop yarn from hook; join E in next sc, working in front of A, C, and D strand, sc in same sc as join, sc in next sc, ch 9, drop yarn from hook, *insert hook in active ch of A strand, bring strand to front of work, holding $\mathrm{C}, \mathrm{D}$, and E strand behind, sc in next 2 sc, ch 9, drop yarn from hook; insert hook in end ch of $C$ strand, bring
strand to front of work, holding D, E, and A strand behind, sc in next 2 sc, ch 9 , drop yarn from hook; insert hook in end ch of $D$ strand, bring strand to front of work, holding E, A and $C$ strand behind, sc in next 2 sc, ch 9 , drop yarn from hook; insert hook in end ch of E strand, bring strand to front of work, holding A, C, and D strand behind, sc in next 2 sc , ch 9, drop yarn from hook; rep from * around. When all sc are worked, cut yarn, leaving 9 " tails. Line up strands in order, being careful to lay them in order on top of one another, sl st each ch end, in order, at base of closest sc. Rnd 3: With F, sc around, working behind strand. Note: Tip ch forward to see sc sts; be careful to work in sc and not in ch.
Fasten off and weave in ends.

## Crochet Gauge

To check gauge, chain 30 to 40 stitches using recommended hook size. Work in pattern stitch until piece measures at least $4^{\prime \prime}(10 \mathrm{~cm})$ from foundation chain. Lay swatch on flat surface. Place a ruler over swatch and count number of stitches across and number of rows down (including fractions of stitches and rows) in $4^{\prime \prime}(10 \mathrm{~cm})$. Repeat two or three times on different areas of swatch to confirm measurements. If you have more stitches and rows than called for in instructions, use a larger hook; if you have fewer, use a smaller hook. Repeat until gauge is correct.

The Craft Yarn Council of America has set up guidelines to bring uniformity to yarn labels and published patterns.


Yarn Weight: The yarn weight symbols that appear in each project are based on the system outlined below. We have consulted the yarn label, the manufacturer's website, and other resources, to classify these yarns as accurately as possible.
*Guidelines only: The below reflect the most commonly used gauges and needle or hook sizes for specific yarn categories.

Hook (metric): $3.5-4.5 \mathrm{~mm}$

## Concentration Ratings

Little concentration required. Straightforward stitching means your hands can work on autopilot.

Some concentration required. Easily memorized stitch patterns and minimal shaping might require some focus and counting.

Fair amount of focus required. Involved stitch patterns, shaping, or assembly require fairly constant concentration.

Extreme focus required. Unusual techniques or complex stitch patterns and shaping require constant focus.


## Half Double Crochet (hdc)

*Yarn over, insert hook in stitch, yarn over and pull up loop (3 loops on hook), yarn over (Figure 1) and draw through all loops on hook (Figure 2); repeat from *.

## Double Crochet (dc)

*Yarn over, insert hook in stitch, yarn over and pull up loop (3 loops on hook; Figure 1), yarn over and draw through 2 loops (Figure 2), yarn over and draw through remaining 2 loops (Figure 3); repeat from *.

## Treble Crochet (tr)

*Yarn over 2 times, insert hook in stitch, yarn over and pull up loop (4 loops on hook; Figure 1), yarn over and draw through 2 loops (Figure 2), yarn over and draw through 2 loops, yarn over and draw through remaining 2 loops (Figure 3); repeat from *.

## Back Post Double Crochet (BPdc)

Yarn over, insert hook from back to front to back around post of corresponding stitch below, yarn over and pull up loop [yarn over, draw through 2 loops on hook] 2 times.

## Back Post Half Double Crochet (BPhdc)

Yarn over, insert hook from back to front to back around post of corresponding stitch below, yarn over and pull up loop, yarn over and draw through all 3 loops on hook.

## Back Post Single Crochet (BPsc)

Insert hook from back to front to back around post of corresponding stitch below, yarn over and pull up loop, yarn over and draw through 2 loops on hook.

## Back Post Treble Crochet (BPtr)

Yarn over 2 times, insert hook from back to front to back around post of stitch to be worked, yarn over and pull up loop [yarn over and draw through 2 loops on hook] 3 times.

## Double Crochet Two Together (dc2tog)

[Yarn over, insert hook in next stitch, yarn over and pull up loop, yarn over, draw through 2 loops] 2 times, yarn over, draw through all loops on hook- 1 stitch decreased.

## Double Crochet Three Together (dc3tog)

[Yarn over, insert hook in next stitch, yarn over and pull up loop, yarn over, draw through 2 loops] 3 times (4 loops on hook), yarn over, draw through all loops on hook-2 stitches decreased.

## Double Crochet Four Together (dc4tog)

[Yarn over, insert hook in next stitch, yarn over and pull up a loop, yarn over, draw through 2 loops] 4 times, yarn over, draw through all loops on hook.

## Foundation Double Crochet (fdc)

Chain 3. Yarn over, insert hook in 3rd chain from hook, yarn over and pull up loop ( 3 loops on hook), yarn over and draw through 1 loop (1 chain made), [yarn over and draw through 2 loops] 2 times (Figure 1) — foundation double crochet. Yarn over, insert hook under 2 loops of chain at bottom of stitch just made, yarn over and pull up loop (3 loops on hook) (Figure 2 ), yarn over and draw through 1 loop ( 1 chain made), [yarn over and draw through 2 loops] 2 times (Figure 3). *Yarn over, insert hook under 2 loops of chain at bottom of stitch just made (Figure 4), yarn over and pull up loop ( 3 loops on hook), yarn over and draw through 1 loop (1 chain made), [yarn over and draw through 2 loops] 2 times. Repeat from ${ }^{*}$ as needed (Figure 5).

## Single Crochet Two Together (sc2tog)

Insert hook in next stitch, yarn over, pull up loop (2 loops on hook, Figure 1), insert hook in next stitch, yarn over, pull up loop ( 3 loops on hook), yarn over and draw through all 3 loops on hook (Figure 2)—1 stitch decreased (Figure 3).


## Single Crochet Three Together (sc3tog)

[Insert hook in next stitch, yarn over, pull loop through stitch] 3 times (4 loops on hook). Yarn over and draw yarn through all four loops on hook. Completed sc3tog2 stitches decreased.

## Half Double Crochet Two Together (hdc2tog)

[Yarn over, insert hook in next stitch, yarn over and pull up loop] 2 times, yarn over and draw through all loops on hook1 stitch decreased.

## Front Post Double Crochet (FPdc)

Yarn over, insert hook from front to back to front around post of corresponding stitch below, yarn over and pull up loop [yarn over, draw through 2 loops on hook] 2 times.

## Front Post Treble Crochet (FPtr)

Yarn over 2 times, insert hook from front to back to front around the post of the corresponding stitch below, yarn over and pull up loop [yarn over, draw through two loops on hook] 3 times.

## Front Post Double Treble Crochet (FPdtr)

Yarn over 3 times, insert hook from front to back to front around the post of the indicated stitch below, yarn over and pull up loop [yarn over, draw through 2 loops on hook] 4 times.

## Tunisian Simple Stitch (tss)

Tss forward pass (FwP): *Insert hook from right to left behind front vertical bar (Figure 1), yarn over and pull up loop (Figure 2), leave loop on hook; repeat from * to last vertical bar at edge, pick up front and back loops of last bar to create firm edge; return pass.
Return pass (RetP): Yarn over and draw through first loop on hook *yarn over and draw through 2 loops on hook (Figure 3); repeat from * to end, ending with 1 loop on hook.

## Tunisian Knit Stitch (tks)

Tks forward pass (Fwp): Skip first vertical bars, *insert hook between next vertical bars under horizontal strands (Figure 1), yarn over and pull up loop, leave loop on hook; repeat from * to end, ending with 1 loop on hook; return pass.
Return pass (RetP): Yarn over and draw loop through first loop on hook, *yarn over and draw through 2 loops on hook: repeat from * across (Figure 2), ending with 1 loop on hook.
