MEASUREMENTS

Approx 2" x 5" [5 x 13 cm] (excluding fringe).

MATERIALS

Bernat® Handicrafter® Crochet Thread™ (85 g/3 oz; 339 m/371 yds or 400 g/14 oz; 1596 m/1746 yds)		
 85 g: Vivid Violet (31305) or 400 g: Vivid Violet (32305)	85 g/3 oz OR 400 g/14 oz	
	1 ball	1 ball
Size 2 mm (U.S. 4) steel crochet hook or size needed to obtain gauge.		

GAUGE

28 sc and 30 rows = 4" [10 cm].

INSTRUCTIONS

Ch 47.

1st row: (WS). 1 dc in 8th ch from hook. *Ch 2. Miss next 2 ch. 1 dc in next ch. Rep from * to end of chain. Turn. 14 sps.

2nd rnd: Ch 3. Miss first ch-2 sp. *[(Yoh) twice and draw up a loop. (Yoh and draw through 2 loops on hook) twice] 3 times in next ch-2 sp. Yoh and draw through all loops on hook – cluster made. Ch 8. Cluster in same ch-2 sp. Miss next 2 ch-2 sps. Rep from * 3 times more. [(Cluster. Ch 8) 4 times. Cluster] in last ch-2 sp. Working along opposite side, **Miss next 2 ch-2 sps. (Cluster. Ch 8. Cluster) in next ch-2 sp. Rep from ** 3 times more. Ch 4. (1 sc. Ch 4. 1 sc) in last ch-2 sp (end). Ch 4. Join with sl st in first cluster.

3rd rnd: Ch 3. Sl st in same sp as last sl st – counts as picot. *4 sc in next ch-8 sp. Ch 3. Sl st in last sc worked – picot made. 3 sc in same ch-8 sp. **Miss next cluster. 1 sc in next cluster. Picot.* Rep from * to * 3 times more, then from * to ** once. (1 sc in next cluster. Picot. Rep from * to ** once) 3 times. Miss next cluster. 1 sc in next cluster. Picot. Rep from * to * 3 times, then rep from * to **. 1 sc in last cluster. Picot. Sl st in next ch-4 sp. Fasten off.

FINISHING: Cut 5 strands of thread each 12" [30.5 cm] long. Fold in half and attach all 5 tog as one fringe to ch-4 sp at end.

Steel crochet hook conversion charts can vary slightly. The important thing to remember is that the size of hook to use is the one which gives you the stated stitch gauge which, when correct, will then produce the measurements specified.
